Introduction

All students residing in High School District 211 may enroll in our tuition summer school program. Summer school provides opportunities for students to improve academic skills and to explore new interests. It enables incoming freshmen to become familiar with the high school routine.

Registration begins on April 30. Please register **early**. Decisions to run most classes will be made by June 8. We must limit class sizes and will close classes when the limit is reached. We will cancel classes with insufficient enrollment.

Refund Policy

Students may receive a 100% refund if they withdraw from a full-tuition academic course before the first class meeting.

Students enrolled in credit courses or in Driver's Education shall receive a partial refund at the level detailed below for:

- any long term illness or injury causing withdrawal from summer school. The refund request must be accompanied by a doctor's verification of the medical condition causing withdrawal.
- a death in the immediate family.

Refund checks for 1st semester will be issued on or near August 13, 2007, and 2nd semester on or near September 24, 2007.

A school administrator and the district summer school administrator must approve all refunds which will be subject to a review of initial payment.

Food Service Options

Limited food service options are available to students attending Summer School. Most schools offer breakfast sandwiches, bagels, doughnuts, snacks, and beverages. Mid-morning options may include soft pretzels, sandwiches, and pizza. Selections vary by school. In addition to traditional service, vending machines offering beverages and snacks are located in the student cafeterias. Summer School food service is a cash only operation; prepayment balances are not accessible. Transportation

District 211 school buses will run for morning credit classes only. District transportation is not provided for afternoon classes. The fee is \$35 for one semester, \$70 for both semesters. **Because of irregular schedules, students in driver education classes may not be able to benefit from bus service.**

Summer School Regulations

Summer school is an academic enrichment program for students who desire additional learning opportunities. Time is precious; each day is equivalent to a week of study during the regular school year. Rules are enforced strictly, quickly, and consistently to maintain an atmosphere conducive to learning. There will be no exceptions made to the rules of conduct or attendance.

What kind of behavior is expected?

During the summer, behavior expectations are the same as during the school year. Students may not wear hats and coats in school. Students who use or possess tobacco, or controlled substances; are truant or excessively tardy; or commit acts of gross misconduct will be immediately dismissed from summer school. These students will forfeit credit and fees for the semester.

What are the attendance rules?

- A student who misses the first two days of a summer school semester will not be allowed to attend class that semester.
- Upon obtaining a third absence, a student will be dropped from summer school.
- A tardy of one hour or less is recorded as one-half day of absence; more than one hour equals a full day. Students arriving late or leaving early must report to the attendance office.
- Please do not schedule summer vacations during the summer school session.
- Students dropped from class do not receive refunds.
- To report an absence or ask a question, please call the summer school office at the school the student is attending.

What are the study requirements?

Students should expect a great deal of homework each day. Absentees must turn in missed work immediately upon their return to school.

What is the final examination policy?

A student who is absent on the last day of the semester may not take the final examination, will not receive credit, and will forfeit all fees for the semester. **Final examinations will not be given early.**

How much credit does a course earn?

Students receive one-half unit of credit for each semester of an academic course. "Make-up" physical education earns one-quarter unit of credit for the semester. Driver education courses earn no credit.

What does "audit" mean?

Students may apply to audit a course. These students are exempted from final examinations. A notation will appear on the school record that the student attended the course and received no credit. Audit students pay full fee.

How does a student register for a class?

Current students should contact their counselor to enroll in summer school. Parents should contact their student's counselor for an appointment, if desired. New students should contact the guidance office at the school they will attend in the fall. District 211 summer school is not available to students entering grade 8 or below.

Art

A153 Art

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

This is the first semester of the Art and Design sequence offered during the regular school year. Students will learn the basics of drawing and color.

Fremd High School — 2nd Semester

Conant High School — 2nd Semester

A253 Drawing

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 unit of credit

This is the drawing class offered as part of the art sequence during the regular school year. In Art Drawing, the skills of observation increase as the eye/hand coordination of the student improves. Students learn to apply the principles of good composition to drawings of all styles and techniques. Subjects and surfaces vary with each assignment to include the figure, landscape, still life, and portrait. Students are trained to work in drawing media such as colored pencils, ink, charcoal, and pastels.

Conant High School — 1st Semester

A902 Photography

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

This enrichment course in black and white photography features cameras, composition, and darkroom techniques. Students must purchase supplies at their own expense and must have access to a 35mm camera. This course does not satisfy the prerequisite for A355 Photography II.

Business Education

B964 Computer Literacy

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

In this one semester course, students will learn basic computer skills and be introduced to the Microsoft Office Suite. *(Due to the nature of this three-week course, students may not develop proficient keyboarding skills.)*

B285 Consumer Education

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 unit of credit

This course is required for graduation.

All schools — 1st or 2nd Semester

Driver Education

P902 Driver Education

Levels: 2,3,4

No credit

To enroll in this program, students must be 16 years of age by September 30, 2007. State law requires that all students must have received a passing grade in eight courses during the two semesters prior to enrolling in driver education. Both classroom and behind-the-wheel instruction are offered. Seats are limited in all sections. **Early registration for this course is essential.** Only residents of High School District 211 are eligible for this course.

Those who do not attend a District 211 high school during the regular school year must register at the G.A. McElroy Administration Center, 1750 S. Roselle Road, in Palatine, and bring a copy of their birth certificate and verification of academic eligibility. (Obtain this form from your own school's administration.) **Because of irregular schedules, students may not be able to benefit from bus service.** Bus transportation is not available for afternoon classes that begin at 1:00 p.m.

All schools — June 13 - July 25

Meeting times vary at all schools; students will receive a class schedule on the first day of class.

English

E101/E102 English

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is for students who need to make up freshman English credit. It focuses on literature, composition, and language.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E201/E202 English

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is for students who need to make up sophomore English credit. It focuses on the study of literature, composition, and language. Units of speech and communication are part of the work at this level.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E301/E302 English

Level: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is for students who need to make up junior English credit. It includes work on writing and the study of American literature. Students will learn research skills and complete a short research project each semester.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E422 English

Level: 4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

Each semester of this course satisfies one semester of the senior-level English requirement for those who need to make up senior English credit for graduation. First semester covers a survey of English literature. Second semester includes improvement of writing skills.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Foreign Languages

L166 Second Semester of Spanish I

Levels: All

1/2 unit of credit

Students who wish to repeat second semester of *L166 Spanish I* may enroll in this course. Students who have had an equivalent of one year of junior high school Spanish may enroll to strengthen their language skills for a successful second year.

L163 German I

Levels: All

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

In German I, students will explore the language and culture of German-speaking people in everyday practical situations. Students will learn basic pronunciation, writing, vocabulary, and conversation.

Health Education

P242 Health Education

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 unit of credit

This course is required for graduation.

All schools — 1st or 2nd Semester

Mathematics

M111 Introduction to Secondary Mathematics

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course applies to the mathematics sequence required for graduation.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M114 Algebra I

Level: 2

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course introduces students to the fundamental principles of algebra.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M117 Second Semester Algebra I

Level: 2

1/2 unit of credit

Students who wish to repeat second semester of *M117 Algebra I* may enroll in this course.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester

M918 Algebra I

Levels: 1,2

1/2 unit of credit

This course is open to incoming freshmen or sophomores who would benefit from instruction in complex algebra skills. This course prepares students for *M218 Accelerated Geometry* or *M328 Accelerated Algebra 2*. Department chair or junior high school recommendation required.

Fremd High School — 1st Semester

Conant High School — 1st Semester

M214 Plane and Solid Geometry

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This study of geometry involves studying the axioms and theorems that relate points, lines, planes, and solids. An overview of plane and solid geometry is presented through geometric constructions, measurement formulas, and limited writing of formal proofs.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M217 Plane and Solid Geometry

Levels: 1,2

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This comprehensive study of plane and solid geometry includes constructions, formulas for measurement, and formal proofs. It is based on the axioms and theorems that relate points, line, planes, and solids. Algebraic techniques are integrated into the solution of many geometric problems. Prerequisite: *M117 Algebra 1 (A,B,C)* or acceptable performance on Algebra examinations is required.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M218 Second Semester of Accelerated Geometry Concept

Levels: 1

1/2 unit of credit

This course is open to incoming freshmen who have been recommended or required to take it in preparation for *M328 Accelerated Algebra 2*. Prerequisite: Department chair recommendation required.

Conant High School — 1st Semester

M312 Integrated Mathematical Topics

Levels: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course reinforces the achievement of high school mathematics benchmarks of the Illinois Learning Standards. A combination of Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2 topics, as specified by the ACT Pathways for Transition score ranges 16-19, will be targeted as well as Work Key style questions of Level 5 and 6. This course requires a graphing calculator. Prerequisite: Department chair approval and two years of credit in high school mathematics is required.

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M428 Accelerated Trigonometry

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 unit of credit

In the study of trigonometry, the student applies algebra and geometry skills to circular and periodic functions and rotational velocity. Additional time is spent on extending the trigonometry identities in this semester course. Students are prepared to take *M449 AP Calculus AB*. Prerequisite: Department chair or teacher recommendation required.

Conant High School — 1st Semester

Physical Education

P903 Physical Education "Make-Up"

Levels: 2,3,4

1/4 unit of credit

Students who must repeat physical education to qualify for graduation may take this course. Activities vary according to abilities and interests of the students enrolled in class. Bus service is **not** available for this course, which meets in the afternoon.

Science

S131/S137 Biology

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation. This course is available only for those students wishing to retake because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

S221 Physical Science

Levels: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

S332 Chemistry

Levels: 2,3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course applies to the science sequence required for graduation. This course is available only for those students wishing to retake because of a failing grade or desiring to improve academic achievement.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Social Studies

G143 World Geography

Levels: All

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is designed to combine a survey of geographic principles pertaining to physical, economic, and political aspects of the world with an application of these principles to the major continents.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

G146 World History

Levels: All

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is a survey of western and non-western civilization.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

G341/G342 U.S. History

Levels: 3,4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is required for graduation.

All schools — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

G441/G442 Social Science Survey

Level: 4

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course applies to the social studies sequence required for graduation.

All schools — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Special Education Courses

E905 Supplemental English

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is designed for students who need to develop basic skills in grammar, writing, reading, and speaking. Students receive classroom instruction in task completion and organizational and study skills.

Palatine High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Hoffman Estates High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

E907 Supplemental Reading

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is designed to develop basic reading skills. Students well below grade level will receive instruction in vocabulary development, decoding, and comprehension. Students will practice reading strategies.

Palatine High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Hoffman Estates High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

M905 Supplemental Math

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This course is designed to develop and improve basic skills in mathematical operations.

Palatine High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

Hoffman Estates High School — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

R920 Summer Enrichment Academy -- Math Improvement

1/2 unit of credit

As recommended within a student's IEP, this six-week special education course provides instruction in mathematics for two hours each day. A special education teacher will help students increase basic math skills and begin developing pre-algebra skills.

Palatine High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

Conant High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

R930 Summer Enrichment Academy -- Reading Improvement

1/2 unit of credit

As recommended within a student's IEP, this six-week special education course provides instruction in English and reading for two hours each day. A variety of learning activities will help students develop skills in reading, decoding, comprehension, grammar, and fundamental writing.

Palatine High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

Conant High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

T910 Supported Work Experience (SWEP)

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

The class focuses on pre-vocational work skills: following directions, work completion, attendance, punctuality, communications, and listening skills. Students participate in a variety of short-term supported job training activities.

Palatine High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

T920 Supplemental Skills (SWEPE)

1/2 or 1 unit of credit

This academic course teaches basic communication skills and mathematics skills. Students continue to develop social skills and become oriented to the high school setting.

Palatine High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

Hoffman Estates High School — 1st and 2nd Semester

Incoming Freshman Invitation Courses

Incoming freshmen students are individually invited to attend specific courses to assist them in developing the skills necessary to become successful in high school.

R924/R925 Incoming Freshman Academy

(by invitation only)

Levels: 1

1 unit of credit

The Incoming Freshman Academy will provide instruction in both mathematics and reading to those incoming freshmen identified as being in danger of not meeting standards on the Prairie State Achievement Exam. The goal of this program is to accelerate student learning in reading and mathematics; strengthen academic preparation for the high school curriculum; and help the student acclimate to high school. Students selected for this mandatory six-week summer program will receive two hours of instruction in both mathematics and reading on a daily basis. Students who successfully complete the program may advance to higher curricular levels.

All schools — 1st and 2nd Semester

R926 Incoming Freshman Academy Mathematics

(by invitation only)

Level: 1

1/2 unit of credit

This course provides necessary support to students in need of accelerating their progress toward algebra readiness. Students will study topics aimed at increasing their number sense and conceptual understanding of pre-algebra concepts. The project-based classroom will use manipulative experiments, cooperative groups, and technology to enhance student learning. At the end of the program, students will be retested for placement into Algebra I.

All Schools — 1st Semester

R927 Incoming Freshman Academy Reading

(by invitation only)

Level: 1

1/2 unit of credit

This course is designed to strengthen skills needed to be successful in high school and to become life-long readers. This three-week intensive course focuses on improvement in reading fluency, comprehension, critical thinking, writing, and vocabulary. A variety of reading strategies will be taught through the use of short stories, novels, and nonfiction selections.

All schools — 1st or 2nd Semester

M917 Pre-algebra

(by invitation only)

Levels: 1

1/2 unit of credit

This course is open to incoming freshmen students who have an algebra placement for the fall semester, but feel that their fundamental skills need to be improved, and to those students who wish to meet the prerequisite for algebra. Students who desire more mathematics upon completing this course should continue with algebra and geometry.

Fremd High School — 1st or 2nd Semester

Conant High School — 1st or 2nd Semester

M938 Algebra I

(by invitation only)

Levels: 1

1/2 unit of credit

This three-week mathematics course is designed to strengthen the geometry and algebra skills needed for success in *M328 Accelerated Algebra 2* and beyond. During this invitational course, algebra concepts will be reviewed in the context of geometry applications.

Conant High School — 1st Semester

R904/905 Project Excel

(by invitation only)

Level 1

1 unit of credit

Project Excel is a six-week program designed to provide intensive English and mathematics skill enhancement at a rigorous level so students will be able to advance to the accelerated level as freshmen. An efficacy-trained instructor will work with the teacher in the classroom to help students develop skills to reach their capacity as a student and as an individual.

All Schools — 1st and 2nd Semester

Sophomore Academy Courses

R934/R935 Sophomore Academy

(by invitation only)

Level: 2

1 unit of credit

The Sophomore Summer Academy will provide instruction in both mathematics and reading to students in danger of not meeting Illinois State standards on the Prairie State Achievement Examination. Instruction is designed to accelerate student learning in reading, writing, and mathematics. Students selected for this mandatory six-week summer program will receive two hours of instruction in both mathematics and reading on a daily basis. Students who successfully complete the program may advance to higher curricular levels.

All Schools — 1st and 2nd Semester

R936 Sophomore Academy Algebra

(by invitation only)

Level 2

1/2 unit of credit

This mandatory three-week course provides necessary support to students in need of accelerating their progress towards meeting state standards in mathematics. This project-based classroom will use manipulative experiments, cooperative groups, and technology to enhance student learning. At the end of the program, students will be retested to determine their sophomore year mathematics course placement.

All Schools — 1st Semester or 2nd Semester

R937 Sophomore Academy Reading

(by invitation only)

Level 2

1/2 unit of credit

This mandatory three-week course will focus on improving student reading fluency, comprehension, critical thinking, writing, and vocabulary. A variety of reading and writing strategies will be taught through the use of short stories, novels and nonfiction selections.

All Schools — 1st or 2nd Semester

Special Courses

R942 ESL Academy English – Level A

Levels: 1-4

1/2 – 1 unit of credit

This course provides support to English language learners who are in the initial stages of acquiring the listening comprehension, oral language, reading, and writing skills needed for English language proficiency. Students are placed in the appropriate level of ESL English Academy based on counselor recommendation. Students attend a three- or six-week course.

All Schools — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

R943 ESL Academy English – Level B

Levels: 1-4

1/2 – 1 unit of credit

Students who are in the process of learning the English language will continue to improve their listening, reading, speaking, and writing skills through this course. Students are placed in the appropriate level of ESL English Academy based on counselor recommendation. Students attend a three- or six-week course.

All Schools — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

R944 ESL Academy English – Level C

Levels: 1-4

1/2 – 1 unit of credit

This course continues the development of the listening, reading, speaking, and writing skills of students who are enhancing their English language proficiency. Students are placed in the appropriate level of ESL English Academy based on counselor recommendation. Students attend a three- or six-week course.

All schools — 1st or 2nd Semester, or both

R945 ESL Academy English – Level D

Levels: 1-4

1/2 – 1 unit of credit

1/2 unit of credit

This course provides necessary support to students in need of accelerating their progress toward algebra readiness. The project-based classroom will use manipulative experiments, cooperative groups, and technology to enhance student learning. At the end of the program, students will be retested for placement into Algebra I.

1/2 unit of credit

Modeled after the philosophy of John Dewey, this program uses the urban setting of the city of Chicago as the classroom, and culminates in student papers and presentations.
